Campus Optics Customer Profile: Rogue Community Colles

With locations in Grants Pass, Medford and White City, Oregon, Rogue Community College offers more than 80 career and technical education degrees and certificates to its nearly 7,000 students.

Sean Taggart, RCC's Director of Risk Management, began exploring options for improving the way his 3-

person team managed campus safety operations in early 2022. The goal was to find a system that was "simply more user friendly."

RCC began its implementation of CampusOptics in October 2022 and started using the system in early December. "Our implementation process was great," said Taggart. "We created a lot of our own data from scratch and it was one of the best implementations I've been involved with." The biggest benefit to CampusOptics is being able to consolidate all of the information and make it accessible to the people who need it. Overall, it creates an operating picture that everyone can see and understand exactly how much work is required to manage campus safety.

RCC kicked off its use of CampusOptics by adding 29 types of assets and over 1,100 different chemical types including Safety Data Sheets. "Right off the bat, we wanted to address our OSHA-related assets including first-aid kits, fire extinguishers, AEDs, eye-wash stations, and emergency showers. We had a lot of different people across campus doing these Rogue Community College

inspections and the system enabled us to consolidate our efforts and get everyone on the same page."

Before CampusOptics, Rogue was using two different systems to manage their chemical inventory. "With CampusOptics, we could manage all of our chemicals in one place, including the ability to barcode and track

> each chemical container. The system also automatically provided the GHS and NFPA along with the Safety Data Sheets. It was a vast improvement over the way things were being done in the past.

> We also manage medical waste, hazardous waste, universal waste and electronic waste across campus. We've been able to move it all into CampusOptics, making the tracking of it so much easier."

Taggart concluded by saying, "The biggest benefit to CampusOptics is being able to consolidate all of the information and make it accessible to the people who need it.
