

Founded in 1912, the University of Memphis is home to more than 21,000 students. The institution's 9person EH&S team oversees safety and compliance activities for 259 buildings and 8 sites across the State of Tennessee.

Bobby Clark, the Director of EH&S at the University of Memphis indicated that, "prior to CampusOptics, we had several different software platforms in EH&S,

In Q1 of 2023, the University of Memphis completed over 10,000 inspections using CampusOptics including extinguishers, exit signs, emergency lights, fume hoods, eye wash stations, indoor air quality, industrial hygiene, hazardous waste areas, and labs.
